B: ANNUAL SPECIAL PUBLIC HEARING MEETING:

1. Chairman Brown informed the membership that the purpose of the public hearing is to inform and allow the membership/tax payers to ask questions or concerns about our budget process and to answer any questions, concerns or recommendations from the public. He then turned the public meeting portion of the meeting over to Treasurer Grupy. Treasurer Grupy briefed the membership on the Budget Committee's work and presented a Fiscal Year 2013-2014 budget (See Enclosure # 1) to the membership for review and questions and answers. Treasurer Grupy also briefed the membership that this was a no growth budget and we are submitting a balanced budget for the same budget amount as last year's budget. Although we are receiving additional property tax dollars we are not receiving any grant funds as in past years. After a general discussion Chairman Brown called for a motion to approve or disapprove the presented 2013/14 budget. Member Jerry Hall made a **MOTION** to approve the Fiscal Year 2013-14 Budget as presented by the Budget / Finance Committee. The motion was SECONDED by Member Joel Siles and APPROVED by all members present. With no further questions the public hearing portion of the meeting was adjourned at 1950 hours and the regular monthly April was called to order by Chairman Brown.

C: READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:

Secretary Pate presented the minutes from the March 19, 2013 Board of Directors meeting
for review and approval. Chairman Brown called for the approval of the March 19, 2013
minutes. MOTION A motion was made by Director Joel Siles to approve the March 19,
2013 Board of Directors meeting minutes as presented. The motion was SECONDED by
Director Jerry Hall and APPROVED by all members present.

D: REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF:

1. General Information: N/A

3. Personnel:

1. The Chief informed the members that we are in excellent personnel posture and continue to have a waiting list of interested volunteers wanting to join our department. Our next Basic Training Class is tentatively scheduled to start on Saturday June 11, 2013.

4. Vehicles:

1. The Chief updated the members on the status of Brush 1941. The graphics have been completed by Image Graphics last Thursday and the truck looks good. We do have several items left to complete the truck before we place it in service. We need to install the radios and some safety guards for our firefighters riding on the back. The Chief passed around a picture of the truck with the new graphics.



2. The Chief informed the membership that he was able to submit another request for additional free surplus vehicles consisting of a 2nd 5 Ton and another utility vehicle with a 1200 Lbs. hydraulic lift. Both are in excellent condition. The utility a 1986 Chevrolet 1 ton truck with a diesel engine will be utilized as our general utility vehicle and will replace the 2008 Ford F-350



which we will sale

due to high repair and fuel costs. We also requested two generators one for Station 13 and a second is on a trailer for mobile applications. Both generators are in excellent conditions and free for the Fire Service. The vehicles will be picked up here in Cumberland County and the two generators are in Clayton, North Carolina. ²

4. Grounds and Buildings:

1. The Chief brought the Directors up to date on the old Station 19 developments and informed the membership that we were offered the opportunity to purchase the old building for the tax value. However the Chief stated we would better spend our funds in a new building and should give the building back to the heirs of Mr. Brown. They have agreed to sign a release from any illegal fees that Mr. Brown stated we owed for the use of the building. We are scheduled to move our property out of the building by or on May 15, 2013. The Chief also informed the membership about the plans for a new building to be built directly behind Station 19 just on the other side of our lawn area in front of the rear parking area. He stated that the Deputy Chief has talked with Mr. Autry about clearing and he has contacted a company recommended by Mr. Autry to build a metal building meeting our needs. The Chief stated that after talking with Mr. Autry the square footage price is actually less for a 50 X 100 than a 40 X 100. He stated that we are also looking for a 20 foot overhang or drive through space to store our trailers and other equipment. The Chief hopes to have more information on a building for the May 2013 meeting.

5. Fire Conditions:

- 1. The Chief updated the members of the board about our current call volume. During the month of March we answered 141 calls. Although the majority of our calls are 1st Responder EMS calls our fire related calls are holding steady by comparison.
- 2. The Chief explained to the members when asked about our current woods and brush fire season that due to a rainier March and much damper weather since February of this year our grass / brush and woods fire have been held to a minimum and we are running 50% below normal for ground cover fires.
- 3. The Chief informed the membership that we have been over the last several weeks busy with working structure fires. We had three (3) within a 10 day period.

6. Training Report:

- The Chief informed the members that our live burn scheduled for Saturday April 20, 2013
 Dark Branch Country Club on Village Drive has been postponed until Saturday May 11,
 2013. This was due to a utility issue that could not be mitigated prior to the original burn
 date.
- 2. The Chief informed the board members that several fire seminars are up-coming in the region and we have several members of the department going to the various fire, rescue and EMS Seminars. Some are going to complete certification courses while others are going to learn and enhance their

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acquired skills. The Chief stated that he was going to take Law and Administration at Cape Fear Community College in Wilmington during the New Hanover County Fire Seminar. Law and Administration covers the North Carolina Administrative Code under which Fire Department administrative statutes are listed.

- 3. The Chief informed the members that we still have several of our members attending various Emergency Medical Technician Courses. One of our full time employees is taking the course to fulfill a condition of employment. Most are scheduled to graduate between now and the end of the summer.
- 4. The Chief stated that we will not start a Pre-basic training course in May but will start one on June 11, 2013.

> Treasurer Alan Grupy Chairman of the Budget Committee presented the Finance and Budget Report at the beginning of the meeting during the Public Hearing Portion of the meeting. (See Enclosure # 1)

G: OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. The Chief informed the Board Members that Attorney Yarborough provided Hope Mills with the corrected Contract. The Chief stated that Town Manager John Ellis send out an e-mail and inquired about the contract, and until we hear back from Hope Mills the issue is in the hands of Hope Mills. Vice Chairman Townsend inquired about the issue of response to the newly annexed areas where our department is the closest and if any further action has been taking since we ran a call and were told by Chief Hodges not to jump any calls unless they call us. The board directed Chief Johnson to continue to jump life threatening calls where we can make the difference between life and death.
- 2. The Chief informed the board members that he has not heard anything from the County about the new fire service contract since the March 19, 2013 meeting. He stated that he inquired but has not heard anything at all.
- 3. The Chief informed the members that he has a bit coming in from Tyson Builders out of Georgia Mr. Autry recommended the firm after he recently purchased a building from the

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company. Mr. Autry recommended that we consider a 50 X 120 versus a 40 X 100. There will be a 20 foot overhang at the end of the 100 foot mark of the building to park our trailers and other equipment underneath as needed – The building is actually cheaper with the larger square footage when we move the span from 40 to 50 feet wide. Hopefully during the next meeting we will have the bit in and we can discuss the issue further.

H. NEW BUSINESS:

1. The Chief stated that the lawn mower here at Station 19 is permanently out of service and we need to replace it. It was a standard yard mower that was not able to sustain the large yard here at 19. He recommended that we pursue the purchase of a commercial lawn mower which is made for larger lawns such as ours. He stated we have a Commercial Mower at Station 13 a Kabuto which we purchased several years ago and it is holding up well. The Chief stated that he had Captain Stoudt go out and get some bits on a commercial made lawn mower. After reviewing all the various mowers the Chief and Captain Stoudt recommend to go with a John Deer X 300 Lawn Mower with a 54 Inch Deck. The lawn mower is commercial grade and comes with an extended limited warranty 4 years or 300 hours. The mower with a rear bagger will run about \$ 3,200.00 plus all applicable taxes. After a general discussion Chairman Brown called for a motion and Director Gary Turlington presented a MOTION to purchase the lawn tractor recommended by the Chief with costs not to exceed \$ 3,500.00 without further board approval. The motion was SECONDED by Director Joel Siles and APPROVED by all members present.

Mr. Martin:

Our departments provide full service fire, rescue and emergency medical services not only to the citizens of our service area, but also to surrounding districts. For Fiscal Year 2013 – 2014 the assessed valuation of the districted is estimated at \$895,890.00 based on your memorandum dated April 13, 2011 SUBJECT: Budget Requests for Fiscal Year 2013-2014.

The Board of Directors continues to monitor and provide for the ongoing need for funds and revenues for the operation of the fire district and in order to sustain our expected service delivery set our annual fire tax rate at .10 cents per one-hundred dollars property tax evaluation. These funds are appropriated to maintain our two (2) full service fire station facilities, purchase and maintain firefighting, EMS and rescue equipment. The funds will also continue to fund a full time staff 14, 8 part time positions and a volunteer staff of over 100 members. We have also continued to budget funds for our accreditation program in order to maintain the accredited status obtained in March 2012 by the Center for Public Safety, Excellence (CPSE). Currently we are the only Volunteer Fire Department in our entire Nation to have achieved and obtained national accreditation. We are due for national re-accreditation in 2017.

Another large line item within our budget is the lease purchase payment on two (2) 2004 Pierce Dash Engine Companies and equipment as well as the land and building payment on our new station 19 fire facility located in the Lake Upchurch Community.

Our district utilizes the cash basis of accounting in its budget, and a copy of our Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Audit has been previously submitted to your internal audit department on March 19, 2013

A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR EACH ITEM, AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE STONEY POINT FIRE DISTRICT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JULY, 2013 AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF JUNE, 2014

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Stoney Point Fire Department Inc., has appointed a budget committee to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body at the proper time; and,

WHEREAS, said proposed budget was open for inspection by the public on Tuesday April 16, 2013 from 7:30 PM until 9:00 PM during the regular scheduled meeting of the Board of Director at the principle office of the corporation located at 2190 Lake Upchurch Road, Parkton, giving any interested taxpayers the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and,

WHEREAS, whatever increases may have been made in the expenditure, like increases were added to the revenues based on grants, fund raisers, and contracts with Cumberland County, City of Fayetteville and the Town of Hope Mills, including any district tax base growth so that the budget remains in balance; and,

WHEREAS, the board of directors continue to support the Special Fire District Tax Funding as well as any associated funding increases in support of low wealth fire district operations, and support the Cumberland County Fire Chief's Association in the purchases of equipment for county-wide enhancement to meet national minimum standards, as well as future ISO/Accreditation requirements to maintain insurance ratings in Cumberland County; and, WHEREAS, the board of directors adopted a .10 cent per one-hundred dollar evaluation in support of the Stoney Point Fire District operations, and support a 1½ per one-hundred dollar evaluation within the Special Fire District Tax jurisdictional areas; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE STONEY POINT FIRE DISTRICT.

That the budget as submitted and identified as Annual Budget Estimate – Revenues (Budget Form A), Annual Budget Estimate – Expenses (Budget Form B), is hereby approved and adopted by the Board of Directors as the Budget of the Stoney Point Fire Department Inc. for the 2013 – 2014 Fiscal Year and shall be made part of the public records of said district. **ADOPTED** this 16th day of April 2013.
