### C: READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:

 Secretary Pate presented the minutes from the March 17, 2015 monthly Board of Directors Meeting for review and approval. Chairman Brown called for the approval of the March 17, 2015 minutes. MOTION A motion was made by Director Turlington to approve the March 17, 2015 Monthly Board of Directors meeting minutes as presented. The motion was **SECONDED** by Director Siles and **APPROVED** by all directors present.

### D: REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF:

### 1. General Information:

- 1. Chief Johnson Sr. asked Vice Chairman Townsend to provide a brief update on Treasurer Al Grupy and asked all the members to continue to remember Al and his wife in our thoughts and prayers as Al continues his bout with his medical condition.
- 2. Guests: None



### 3. Personnel:

Chief Johnson advised that we started our 2<sup>nd</sup> recruit class for the year last Saturday April
18, 2015 with thirteen (13) new recruits. He expects about a 50% drop out rate as we
continue the training process. He further stated that we already have sufficient
applications on file to start another class, which we have projected to start in June.

### 4. Vehicles:

- 1. Chief Johnson stated that he directed Assistant Chief Murphy to follow up with Atlantic on the repairs which have not started. The unit Engine 1333 which is still at Atlantic with no work initiated or completed on the truck since it burned back in April 2014. We are also looking at a unit on GovernmentSales.org for a replacement unit if we can find one and use the funds to replace the truck rather than repairing it. The company has advised that it will not be able to repair the unit for the repair quote provided by the insurance adjuster, and we have instructed them to contact the adjuster in order to get the truck repaired.
- 2. The Chief stated that the replacement vehicle approved during last month's meeting has been ordered is scheduled to arrive within the next several weeks. This utility truck will be the primary vehicle to move our emergency trailers such as the Foam Unit, Boat Trailer and the Air Trailer and therefore will not be utilized for general or administrative purposes. Members will continue to utilize the 1987 Chevrolet Pick-Up that we especially prepared and placed in service for that purpose.
- 3. Chief Johnson briefed the board members on the new 5 ton currently being retrofitted as a brush unit for Station 13. All the work is being done in-house by Captain Stoudt and Engineer David Stewart. He asked the board members to join him and reviewing the truck in the apparatus bay. We are anticipating the apparatus to be complete sometimes late June 2015.
- 4. Deputy Chief Johnson Jr. brought the membership up-to-date on the progress and work that is being completed by the new-truck and vehicle replacement committee. The committee consisting of officers and firefighters has been working since the first of the year to prepare specifications on a new Engine Company and a new Rescue Truck. Deputy Chief Johnson stated that hopefully we should have some preliminary specifications ready by the start of the new Fiscal Year. Several additional meetings are necessary to complete the committee's work. He stated that he along with selected personnel are looking to tour the Pierce facility prior to ordering any apparatuses to insure we are aware of the latest trends in technology and fire apparatus manufacturing.
- 5. Chief advised that the 2007 Crown Victoria Chief's Vehicle with over 165000 miles on the vehicle is starting to show the wear and tear. We purchased the vehicle from the North Carolina State Highway Patrol surplus program in 2009 with 88000 miles on the unit. The vehicle is starting to cost us money and we will start looking at a replacement vehicle sometimes in the future.

### 4. Grounds and Buildings:

 Currently there are no building or grounds issues. We have turned on both sprinkler systems at both Station 13 and 19. We need to replace our flower bed pine straw at Station 19 and Director Turlington stated that he would prepare us a load of pine straw in the immediate future.

### 5. Fire Conditions:

1. Chief Johnson briefly talked about the current call volume and handed out the newly released National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS) statistical report released by the North Carolina Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM). The report shows all the calls answered during 2014 by all the departments in Cumberland County. A discussion on the report followed, with Chief Johnson identifying the various categories within the report for clarification purposes. (See Enclosure # 2) He also handed out 2014 NFIRS statistical information prepared for our 2014 Annual Report by the Clerk to the Board. (See Enclosure # 3). Vice Chairman Townsend inquired




about the various NFIRS Codes and what they represented. Chief Johnson Sr. provided the following explanation concerning the various NFIRS Codes.

1. Chief Johnson advised that training is on-going but we are in the process of running several Firefighter I & II classes and we also have scheduled a Trench Rescue Class in



- May here at our station. He explained that Trench Rescue Services are provided by the City of Fayetteville under contract with Cumberland County.
- 2. Chief Johnson Sr., advised the board members that he will be attending the New Hanover County Fire & Rescue Seminar this up-coming weekend in order to take an advanced Arson Investigative Class. He stated that his Fire Arson Certification expires in December of this year and he needs the continuing education hours in in order to renew the certification.
- Chief Johnson advised that during our upcoming Fire Chief's Association Meeting on Monday April 27, 2015 the Chief's 101 upgrade class will be presented in order for all Cumberland County Fire Chief's to upgrade their certification.

- 1. Vice Chairman Larry Townsend provided both the Treasurer's report and the oversight reports for the months of February and March 2015. Mr. Townsend indicated that the March report indicated several issues dealing with payroll which were corrected on the spot. Vice Chairman Townsend presented all the transactions for the indicated months for review by the board members and answered questions. Chairman Brown called for a motion to approve both the Treasurer's report and the oversight reports as presented. MOTION: Director Siles made a motion to approve both the treasurer's report and the oversight report for the months of February and March 2015. The motion was SECONDED by Director Turlington and APPROVED by all members present. (See Enclosure # 4 & 5)
- Auxiliary Account Treasurer Kathy Picon provided the current Auxiliary treasurer's
  fund balance as \$ 212,179.51 as of today. We have recently sent three (3) members to
  attend the Haunted Attraction Seminar in St. Louis and spend some funds on props and
  equipment for our 2015 haunt. We send our primary coordinators each year to attend
  the seminar.
- 3. Miscellaneous FF Account The Chief reported that there is no change with the ICE & CAN and Miscellaneous FF's Account Balances of \$ 7,691.45 with additional ICE deposit pending. He stated that we will order a new ICE Storage Machine for Station 13 in support of our ICE Sales.
- 4. Pension Fund Vice Chairman Townsend the treasurer of the Pension Fund advised that our current Pension Fund Balance with North State Bank is \$ 54,810.81. Vice Chairman Townsend also advised the members present that we will reimburse our general fund in the amount of \$ 4,080.00 from the Pension fund. He passed around an approval letter received from the NCSFA approving the reimbursement for the 2015 Pension Fund Dues. (See Enclosure # 6)
- Child Passenger Safety Seat Account The current CPSS fund balance with Wells
  Fargo is \$ 1,280.75. This fund is exclusively for CPS equipment and is maintained by
  donations.

### G: OLD BUSINESS:

 The Chief reported that Firefighter Michael Frederickson is continuing to work on our computer network systems as time allows. Hopefully our system will be fully operational within the next several months. He stated that the work is time consuming, whereas each of our computers has issues that must be addressed. In the end we should have all the same programs and not various programs as we do now. All our computer stations will be unified and alike operating on the same systems operating system and Word 2013 Version. Michael will be reimbursed on a monthly basis for his IT responsibilities in the amount of \$ 250.00 monthly. This is a savings to the department of \$ 550.00 monthly.

- 2. The Chief stated that we are still in the process of coordinating a 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary dinner sometimes in June now. The issue is finding a caterer that isn't already booked or able to provide food for about 250 invited guests.
- 3. Chief Johnson Sr. reported that Lieutenant Michael Minnick is making progress with our new web-page and we are currently updating and fixing issues with the site, but it is up and running and can be found at stoneypointfire.com
- 4. The Chief stated that our Easter Egg Hunt was a big success with over 500 Children accompanied by their parents participating. We did receive one complaint by a parent who showed up 20 minutes late for her child's age group with the event already over for the age group. We broke the entire event down by age group and started at 1 PM. The event was free to the public.
- 5. Chief Johnson Sr. stated that the Annual Strategic Planning Session conducted on Saturday April 11, 2015 at Station 19 was an excellent planning session. Our updated Strategic plan will be ready for approval by the board during the May 2015 meeting. The accreditation process requires that our Strategic Plan is updated and approved by the governing board annually.
- 6. The Chief reminded the board members that Southern Curb & Gutter Inc., will start on our Station 19 back building parking lot project within the next several weeks. The owner Mr. Roger Hart provided a quote for \$ 14,182.80 back in January 2015 when the board was informed of the project. This includes curbing which will be tied into our existing curbing and concrete ramps and pads for the new back building. It does not include paving. (See Enclosure # 7)

### H. NEW BUSINESS:

- Chief Johnson passed around a Resolution of Appreciation presented to our Department from the Town of Lake Waccarnaw adopted on November 17, 2014 when we sold 1931 our old 1994 Spartan Gladiator (Quality) Engine to the town. (See Enclosure # 8) The Chief stated that we will hang the resolution on the wall at Station 19 for everyone to review.
- 2. The Chief briefed the directors on the newly released procedures for Fire and EMS Background Checks. A brief discussion followed concerning the subject. Chief Johnson stated that we have required back ground checks from new applicants for years now. He stated that he makes it an individual responsibility to provide us with a current background check prior to allowing anyone to participate. He passed around an informational bulletin from the Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM). (See Enclosure #9)

- 3. Chief Johnson informed the members that he posted a job opening for a Firefighter II created with the immediate resignation of one of our full time employees earlier this month. (See Enclosure # 10)
- 4. The Chief provided the board members a quick up-date on current issues and action taken by the North Carolina Fire and Rescue Commission.
- Chief Johnson Sr., passed around a Thank You Note received from Fire Chief Roddy Bullard, Vander Fire District whose daughter passed away unexpectently. (See Enclosure # 11)

### Procedure for Fire and EMS Background Checks

Effective Jan. 1, 2015, North Carolina law authorizes criminal history checks for current volunteer or paid fire department personnel and emergency medical services personnel.

The North Carolina Department of Insurance Office of State Fire Marshal has been working with the State Bureau of Investigation Criminal Identification Section to create a guide to assist fire departments and EMS agencies with the process. The following procedure is the result of that collaboration and has been vetted by the SBI. It should provide some direction to make this process a little clearer for the departments and agencies throughout the state.

Procedure for Fire Departments and Emergency Medical Services agencies to receive criminal history records checks of applicants and current members (NCGS §143B-943)

### February 2015

- 1) Requests can only be made by a designated Homeland Security director (paid only), a local fire chief of a rated fire department (paid or volunteer), a county fire marshal (paid only), an emergency services director (paid only). This will be the Authorized Official.
- 2) Each Authorized Official (such as fire chief) must request and submit an Access Agreement form for its agency. The Access Agreement may be requested by calling 919.582.8600 or emailing <a href="mailto:ciishelp@ncdoj.gov">ciishelp@ncdoj.gov</a>. The Access Agreement must be completed, signed, notarized and mailed back to the SBI Criminal Identification Section.

Approval of the Agreement should take 2-4 weeks.

- 3) An initial supply of blank fingerprint cards will be provided by the SBI in the agreement package. More fingerprint cards can be ordered from the SBI by following instructions included in the agreement package.
- 4) Using the fingerprint card provided, the fire chief arranges for each applicant or member to have fingerprinting done at their local police department or sheriff's office to ensure that it is done properly. There may be a local fee for this, depending on local practice.

- 5) The completed fingerprint card is returned to the fire chief, who will then mail it to the Criminal Identification Section at the address above. There is a 38.00 fee per card submitted. This will be billed back to the fire department (as per the Agreement) at the end of each month.
- 6) The results of the criminal history records check will be mailed back to the fire chief. This will typically be within 1-2 weeks from receipt of the fingerprint card to the SBI. All information provided is privileged information and for the exclusive use of the fire chief only for the purpose authorized in NC General Statute 143B-943, and must be locked and secured at all times. Specific responsibilities and requirements are explained in the access agreement.
- 7) (GUIDANCE FOR USE OF DATA FOR FIRE CHIEF) -If the applicant's or current member's verified criminal history record check reveals one or more convictions, then the conviction shall constitute just cause for not selecting the applicant for the position or for dismissing the current member from a current position with the local fire department or emergency medical services. The conviction shall not automatically prohibit volunteering or employment; however, the following factors shall be considered by the local Homeland Security director, local fire chief, county fire marshal, emergency services director, or local law enforcement agency in determining whether the position shall be denied or the current member dismissed from a current position:
  - (a) The level and seriousness of the crime:
  - (b) The date of the crime;
  - (c) The age of the person at the time of the conviction;
  - (d) The circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, if known;
  - (e) The nexus between the criminal conduct of the person and the duties of the person;
  - (f) The prison, jail, probation, parole, rehabilitation, and employment records of the person since the date the crime was committed; and
  - (g) The subsequent commission by the person of a crime listed in subsection (a) of this section.
  - (h) The local fire department or emergency medical services may deny the applicant or current member the position or dismiss an applicant or current member who refuses to consent to a criminal history record check or use of fingerprints or other identifying information required by the State or National Repositories of Criminal Histories. This refusal constitutes just cause for the denial of the position or the dismissal from a current position.
  - (i) The local fire department or emergency medical services may also extend a conditional offer of the position pending the results of a criminal history record check.
