The monthly meeting of the Stoney Point Fire Department Inc., Board of Directors was called to order by Chairman Brown and was let in prayer by Chief Johnson Sr. at 7:30 PM. The meeting was conducted at Station 19.

C: READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Chief Johnson Sr. in the absence of Secretary Pate presented the minutes from the January 18, 2011 Board of Directors meeting for review and approval. Chairman Brown called for the approval of the January 18, 2011 meeting. **MOTION** A motion was made by Director Alan Grupy to approve the January 18, 2011 minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Director Jerry Hall and **APPROVED** by all members present.

D: REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF:

Personnel:

1. Chief Johnson Sr. stated that our current active membership roster is at 101 members and we have several of our military members deployed both to Iraq and Afghanistan. So far this year in 2011 we already had four (4) new members apply and join the department. Two (2) were fully certified firefighters/emt's – One (1) from New York and the other from Oklahoma. Both are military and have an interest in continuing their public service. Two (2) more are scheduled to start our Pre-Basic Orientation Program scheduled for March 5, 2011 here at Station 13. The Chief stated that four additional applications are pending back ground checks and hopefully these members will be able to start in April, providing there are no problems with their back-ground checks.
2. Chief Johnson stated that effective March 1, 2011 Lieutenant Lee will be promoted to Captain and Engineers Cook, Gale and Stewart will be promoted to Lieutenant. All meet the NFPA 1021 Fire Officer Professional Qualification Standards for their appropriate rank as outlined in our By-Laws.

Vehicles:

1. Engine 1932 (1985 Pierce Dash) remains out of service due to the booster tank issue. The cold weather is a major hold up on the project. With warmer weather ahead this project will be moved up in the priority.
2. Engine 1331 (2004 Pierce Dash) had all four batteries replaced. One (1) had a dead cell and two (2) more were in the process of failing. The problem surfaced when the truck wouldn't start and the battery would not hold a charge.
3. Squad 1371 (2002 Chevrolet 1500 HD) had the body damage repaired at Web's Paint and Body Shop from the accident during the snow last month. A driver not able to stop slid into our truck at an accident scene on Stoney Point Road during the last major snow storm.

Grounds and Buildings:

1. Chief Johnson stated that Captain Stoudt has been repairing some of the sheetrock damaged from normal wear and tear at Station 19.

Fire Conditions:

1. During the month of January we answered 143 calls.²

Training Report:

1. Chief Johnson stated that all the Chief Officers attended the Chief's 101 Class at Stoney Point Elementary School last month. This class is good for five (5) years. It was an excellent class and everyone enhanced their overall knowledge dealing with Fire Department Operations and State Requirements, grants, Line of Duty Deaths, NFIRS etc.

Accreditation:

1. Assistant Chief Clouston our Accreditation Manager is finalizing our Standards of Cover (SOC) and Deputy Chief Melvin is finalizing some statistical information from Fire House. All our categories have been submitted and we are waiting on feed-back from CPSE.

1. Treasurer Al Grupy presented the financial transaction report and update for the month of December 2010 and January 2011, and Director Larry Townsend presented to the Board a Memorandum outlining his oversight review for the months of December 2010 and January 2011 with no discrepancies noted for the listed months (**See Enclosure # 1**). Chairman Brown asked the board members to approve the Financial Transaction and Oversight Report for the listed months.³

MOTION – A motion was made by Director Jerry Hall to approve both the financial transactions and review by Director Townsend. The motion was seconded by Chairman Brown and **APPROVED** by all members present. (Chairman Brown seconded the motion due to the absence of three (3) board members and whereas both Directors Grupy and Townsend presented the information requiring the vote).

2. The Auxiliary reported that the current auxiliary fund balance is \$ 116,272.51
3. Chief Johnson stated that the ICE/Can Trailer Fund is \$ 5,372.17
4. Treasurer Grupy reported that our Certificate of Deposit with North State Bank matured on February 7, 2011 and automatically renewed with a new maturity date of July 7, 2011. (See Enclosure #2)

G: OLD BUSINESS:

1. Chief Johnson stated that we still do not have our Mobile Data Computers from the City of Fayetteville. He stated that he called Chief Nichols to inquire and was informed that the COF IT Department had eight (8) open employment positions and was running behind. He stated that Chief Nichols will inquire and get back to us.
2. Chief Johnson stated that he will now forward to FF. Bourget our Web Manager all our Board of Directors Minutes and newly adopted By-Laws for posting on our Web Page. He will go back 12 months on the minutes. He reminded the members that we had discussed this earlier but now is when everything is ready for posting and we will continue to post our minutes henceforth.⁴

H. NEW BUSINESS:

1. Chief Johnson briefly talked about the pending Gates Four Annexation and the current court process.

2. Chief Johnson stated that he received two (2) certified letters from the Town of Hope Mills concerning the voluntary annexation of several parcels of lands on both sides of Millstone Shopping Center. He stated that he called Town Manager Randy Beeman for more clarification of the properties in questions. The notification included no maps or parcel numbers only two (2) names of the property or land owners. (Lowery Property 2.84 acres & Landstone LLC 6.86 acres) The Chief stated that he had no idea where this property was located within the district. On February 11 we received a follow up Memo with two vicinity maps. The Chief stated that he would research the properties and return the requested information to Hope Mills utilizing the February 11, 2011 date as a starting point. That's the date we received more detailed information. The Chief stated he would have to go to the county planning/tax department to get pertinent information requested. (See Enclosure # 3)

3. Chief Johnson informed the board members that the City of Fayetteville (COF) fire code inspection departments send Fire Inspector Jeff Fogle out to meet with us about our Trail of Terror. The Chief stated that as we move towards our 2011 trail we want to insure that we incorporate additional fire safety into our trail. We have always had fire safety in our trail by utilizing and dedicating two (2) Fire Trucks with six (6) manned and pre-staged hose lines during trail operations, however they had some concerns. The Chief stated that he was in the process of finding an Engineer to submit an engineer drawing of our buildings along with any associated fire alarm requirements that may be required. We are extremely fire safety conscious, and have fire safety personnel (Fire Watch) equipped with communication stationed throughout the trail during operations in addition to the manned hose lines. The fire watch personnel are responsible to ensure the continuous and systematic surveillance of a building and trail for the purpose of identifying and controlling fire hazards, detecting early signs of unwanted fire, raising an alarm of fire and notifying firefighters manning the hose lines. The code is about notifying the Fire Department and we have to remember we are the Fire Department. The NC Fire Prevention Code authorizes the utilization of Fire Watch Personnel. Furthermore, each scene is equipped with an approved fire extinguisher and all actors are briefed on the location of the fire extinguishers within their scenes, and how to appropriately use a fire extinguishers and what to do in case of an emergency, such as evacuation routes and meeting points. He also stated that we prepare an entire Incident Action Plan (IAP) and everyone involved is briefed on the plan execution. Emergency Lighting to light up the entire trail has been installed, with additional emergency lights on each fire truck. He stated that the plan is to move this venture to station 19 where we have more space, but this will take approximately 3 years to complete. He stated that it is our intentions to plan the station 19 trail very carefully and put it in place correctly and in accordance with the appropriate building and fire codes. He stated that he will keep us informed.

5. Chief Johnson presented the Annual Statistics for board members to review and stated that he was working on the Annual Report which should be ready during the March meeting. He pointed out that our volunteers in 2010 contributed 18,894 hours of volunteer public service.⁵

He stated that the North Carolina General Assembly in a 2000 legislation approved non-professional volunteer services to be valued at a statewide average wage rate as calculated from data compiled by the Employment Security Commission in the Employment and Wages in NC annual report. The 1999 report, the most recent one that Chief Johnson could find, posts this volunteer rate at \$ 14.13 per hour. Since this report is about 12 years old the figure was rounded up to \$ 15.00 per hour. This equals a savings of \$ 283,410.00 for training and incident response times, and represents members responding during all times of the day, night, weekend and holidays. He stated that we saved another \$ 657,000.00 for over-night stand-by duty for a total savings to our tax-payers of \$ 940,410.00. By the time we add in the Trail of Terror volunteer hours the total savings to our citizens is over 1 Million Dollars. He stated that our volunteer members receive \$ 5.00 for each night spent at the fire department and \$ 3.00 per incident attendance. The Chief also stated that more details will be provided in the Annual Report. (See Enclosure # 4)

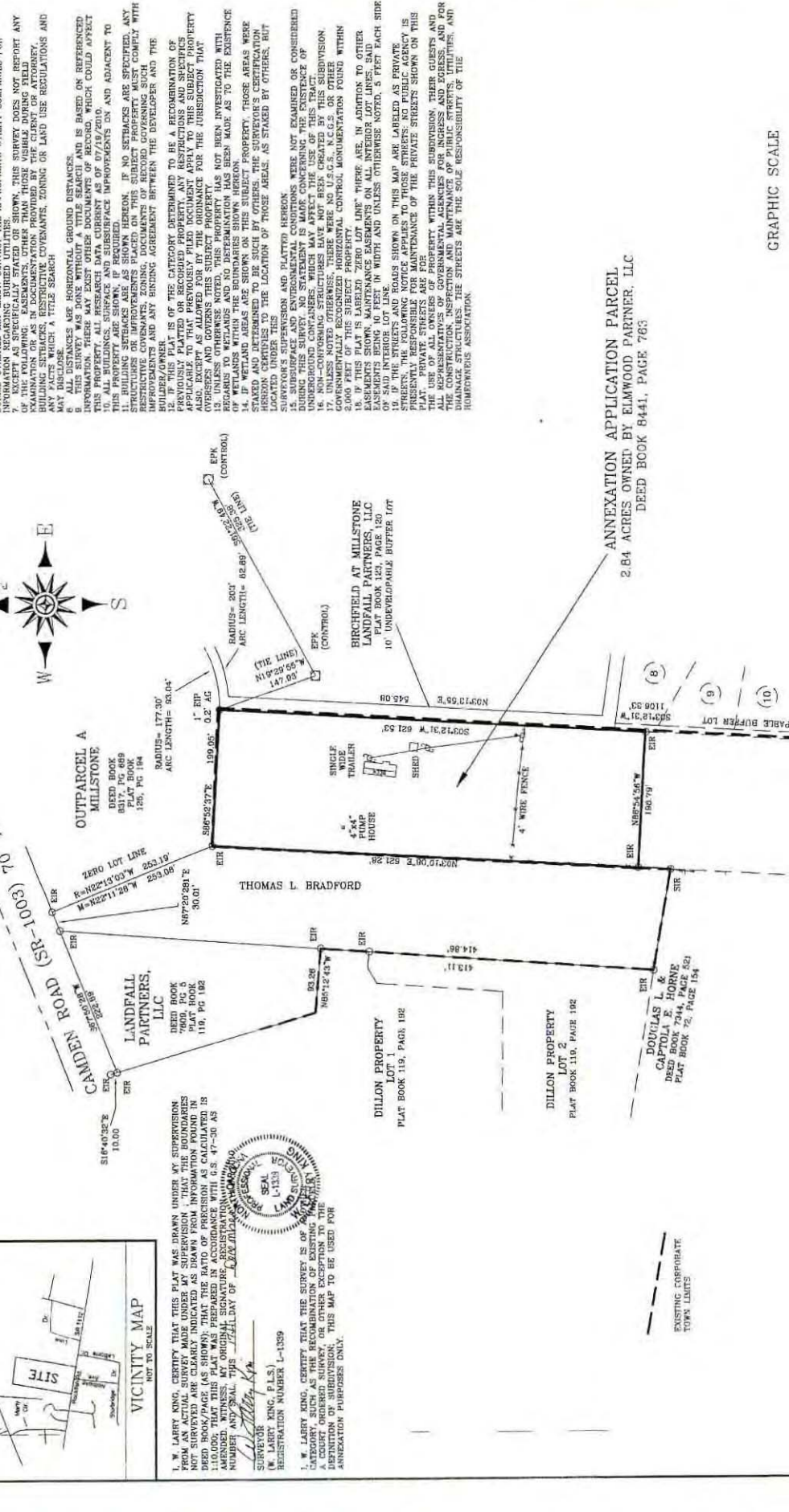
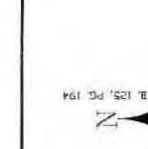

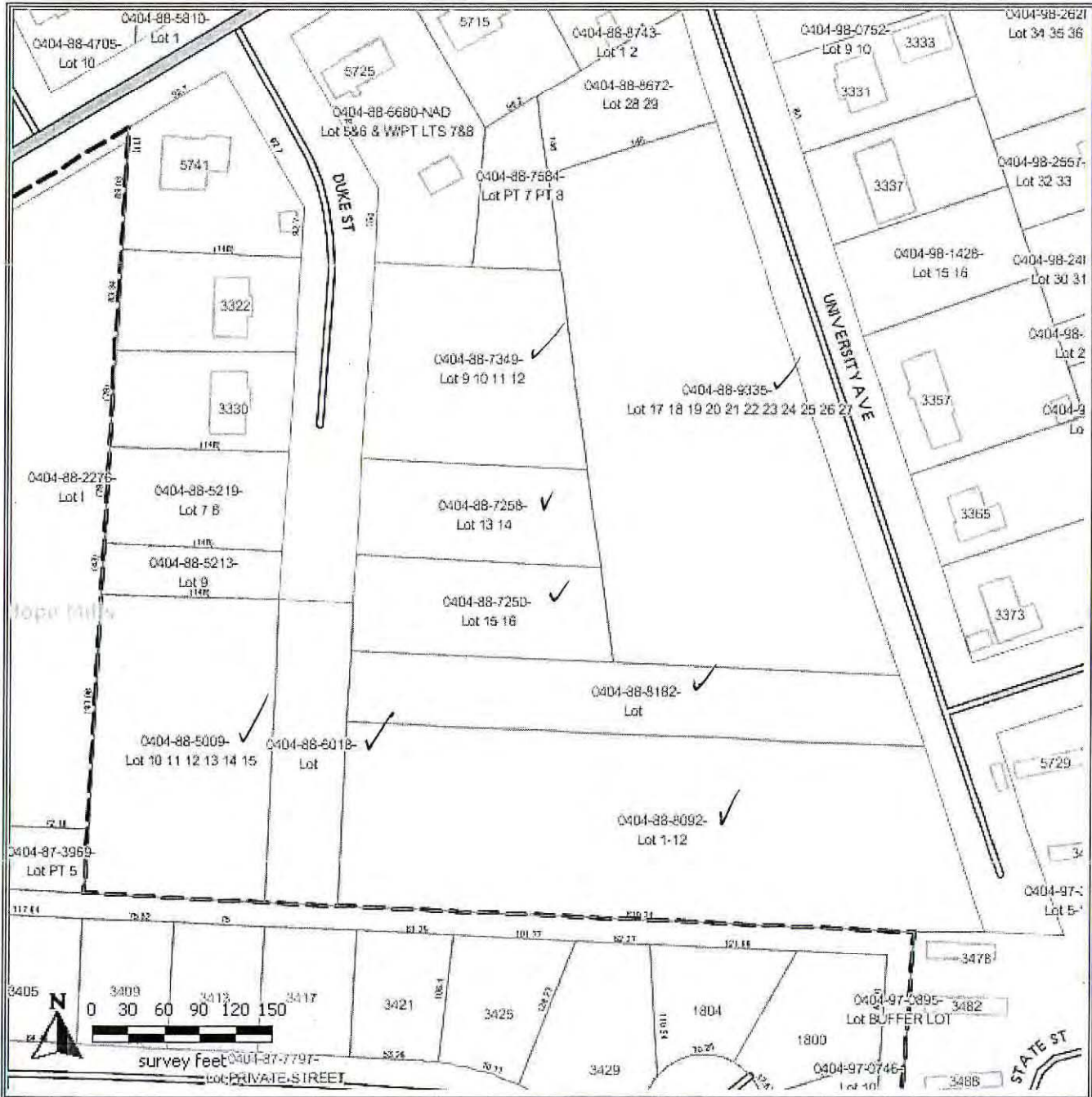
